The estimation and measurement should be made when the Clinical condition has reached the stage of maximum improvement from the medical treatment. The mean percentage of loss of muscle strength around a joint is multiplied by 0.30. Involves more than one joint the mean loss of percentage in each joint is calculated separately and then added together.

Nutritional factors are an important component in selected diseases. It is generally agreed that diet governs many situations favouring the onset of diseases related heart. Impaired metabolism of glucose in body leads to excess of glucose in blood and urine. Obesity is a health problem in richer and some developing countries. Basic cause of obesity is overnutrition.
